

**Approved Minutes  
West Fairlee Selectboard Meeting  
Monday April 18, 2016**

**Present: Bev Ash, Delsie Hoyt, Steve Malinoski, Al Pfeiffer – no Fred  
Visitors: Bruce Durkee, Dan Magoon, Doug Stone**

The meeting was called to order at 5:43 p.m.

**Approve minutes of April 4, 2016, 2016 Regular Meeting - Deferred.**

**Visitors/ Hear and act on reports of Town Officers and Committees**

- Westshire ATV Club: Bruce Durkee and Doug Stone offered the Town their usual Green-Up Day assistance, which was gratefully accepted. The Club will also be grading and seeding the ATV trails which are no longer in use in Brushwood Forest. They also indicated that they would be doing maintenance on the table and shelter at Southworth Park, but will not be able to continue to provide mowing. The Selectboard will take the latter topic up at the next meeting.

- King Hill Road - Dan Magoon reiterated his request that King Hill Road be closed to public traffic beyond his driveway. When the topic was discussed last fall, it was the consensus of the Selectboard that King Hill was a public highway and should not be gated, thrown up, or converted to a trail. Hoyt polled the Selectboard and there was no desire to revisit the issue. Mr. Magoon stated that since the Board would not close King Hill, he would discontinue agreements with the Cross Rivendell Trail and the ATV Club to cross his property. Hoyt stated that the Town cannot make decisions of public highway access based on a quid pro quo or needs of outside organizations, however worthwhile they may be. ATV Club representatives Durkee and Stone said they would remove trail signage from Mr. Magoon's property and create a turn-around on Malinoski's property. Hoyt has been working with individuals from Rivendell Trails to find a suitable detour with adjoining landowners.

- Update Tri-Town Lake Fairlee Dam Committee – Steve/Fred – Steve reported that he had heard not a "dam" thing. No Executive Session was required.

**Review Treasurer's Financial Statements/Journal Entries**

**Roads** – RFP for repave - Will be done at the first meeting in May, which should be plenty of time.

- Annual highway grant application - Delsie

Meeting with District #4's Chris Bump – Delsie met with him; they agreed to put in \$15,000 structures grant for engineering for the Godfrey Road culvert replacement, and about \$5,400 for the guardrail replacement on the culvert below Beebe 's dam.
